# Scope Parts

- 1. Ocular Lens
- 2. Windage (horizontal) Adjustment
- 3. Elevation (vertical) Adjustment
- 4. Power Selector Ring
- 5. Objective Lens



# Mounting the Scope

- There are two ring mounts that are provided with this scope. These may or may not work with your current application. Please consult your local firearms dealers if you are unsure or have any questions pertaining to mounting the scope.
- To separate the rings use the provided Allen key and take off the top portion of the rings by removing the four Allen screws on each ring.
- Place scope in the lower ring cradles and begin to put the tops back on the ring cradles. In this operation please only finger tighten. Scope should be able to move freely at this point for adjustment
- Loosen the mounting screws on the base of the scope rings and mount to the rail of the gun.
- Put the rifle to your shoulder in your natural shooting position and adjust the scope towards your or away from you to obtain the best eye relief. This goal is achieved when you have a full field of view while looking down the scope
- After adjusting the eye from above please rotate the scope to make sure that the image and or crosshair on the scope are vertical and perpendicular to the gun.
- When all adjustment is completed please tighten all screws to ensure a firm grip on the scope

A CAUTION

DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN THE SCREWS AS YOU COULD CAUSE PERMANENT DAMAGE TO THE INTERNAL FUNCTIONS OF THE SCOPE AND THE SCOPE BODY.

WARNING: If a scope is mounted too far to the rear, the eyepiece can injure the shooter's brow. Therefore, when mounting your scope, we recommend positioning it as far forward in the mounts as possible to take full advantage the eye relief provided.

# How To Sight-In

NOTE: The windage and elevation adjustments on our scopes are centered as part of the manufacturing process

A CAUTION

ALL SHOOTING SHOULD BE DONE IN A SAFE AREA OR APPROVED RANGE.

Using a Bore-Sighting Collimator

To save time and ammunition, start out in your shop or gun room with a bore-sighting collimator. Follow the directions included with the collimator for specific instructions on its proper use. Please note that this will does not zero your scope in; please refer to further instructions to accomplish this.

#### Final Zeroing Of Scope

- Place a target 25 yards away
- Set the zoom to the highest level by rotating the Power Selection Ring
- Place Rifle, Shotgun, or Airgun into a bench rest to ensure stability
- Adjust windage and elevation turrets as needed to fine tune accuracy
- Each click of the turret is equal to 1/4 M.O.A at 100 yards

# Maintenance Instructions

2.5x20MM SCOPE

Remember to always keep your scope lenses as clean as possible during use. Never clean debris and marks from scope lenses by rubbing with a dry cloth or tissue. You should always moisten the lens before wiping, and always brush loose material from the lens surface using a lens brush. Always clean the lens with non-abrasive cleaning fluid and then wipe clean in circular motions. All moving parts of the scope are permanently lubricated. Do not try to lubricate them. No maintenance is needed on the scope's outer surface, except to occasionally wipe off dirt or fingerprints with a soft cloth using water.

### NOTE - Power Selector Ring

If your scope is equipped with a power selector ring, no lubrication is ever required on the ring itself. Never loosen the flat head screw on the power selector ring. This will cause the loss of internal gas that is put in to keep the scope fog free.
